Fallen Mangos

My father-in-law has a variety of fruit trees in his backyard. Living in Florida, they are not the peaches and plums that we are used to in Texas, but mangos, papayas, star fruit, and loquat. This year he has a bumper crop of mangos and although there are still a few weeks before they are ripe on the tree, the branches are drooping with the heavy fruit. When The Lord Established His Church
